2004 BIRTH CERTIFICATE SUMMARY & HIGHLIGHTS

This year 2004 Birth Certificate Summary Report of 3909 births includes all births to Santa Cruz County residents (3391) and an additional 518 births to women who live in other counties but delivered in Santa Cruz County. Of the 3391 county residents' births, 184 delivered outside of the county and the indicator data concerning their births is shown in the "Out-of-County" column in Table I. The 518 non-county residents' birth data included in this report are interspersed among the three delivery facilities in the county, with Watsonville Community Hospital delivering the greater majority (380) of non-Santa Cruz County residents. 433 of the out-of-county residents live in Monterey County, with 191 of these births to Monterey County residents living in zip code 95076 (Watsonville) and 242 from other areas in Monterey County.

HIGHLIGHTS OF HEALTH INDICATORS

◆ BIRTHS TO TEENS increased in overall numbers this year by 20, but the *rate* remains consistently low at 31.7 (per 1000 female population). This is well below California's rate of 38.9 in 2003 (the latest available). Of the 378 teen births, 265 (70%) of them were to south county residents in Watsonville and Freedom and 88% were to Hispanic teens county-wide. Sixty (16%) were the second birth or more for the teen. This rate of second birth as a teen remains lower than both the California State average (20.5%) and USA average (21.2%). In comparison to the total birthing population, teens had higher rates of inadequate care, late or no prenatal care, and lower rates of low birth weight and pre-term births as shown below.

- ◆ <u>MEDI-CAL BIRTHS</u> increased to 48.8% of total births in the county this year. Watsonville Community Hospital continued to have the highest number of births funded through Medi-Cal (74.5%) and continued to deliver the majority of the county's Medi-Cal funded births (67%). Of the 518 births to out of county residents, 56% were funded by Medi-Cal.
- ♦ <u>LOW BIRTHWEIGHT</u> (under 5.5 pounds) babies continue at a steady, low level of 5.1%, well below California's 6.6%. Forty-one babies under 3.3 pounds were delivered this year, a number slightly lower than last year. Twenty-three of those very low birthweight babies were to Hispanic women and seventeen of them to Caucasian women.
