- b) Leveraging existing solid waste disposal resources and improving overall litter efforts of the County of Santa Cruz and Cities of Santa Cruz and Watsonville.

Background

DRAFT Santa Cruz County SSP 3-pronged approach

Syringe Distribution

- Fixed hours at County locations
- One-for-one Exchange
- Secondary Exchange for up to 2 individuals
- Maximum of 100 syringes per participant
- Maximum 100
 syringes for each
 secondary individual

Syringe Collection

- Provide personal sharps containers for SSP participants, pharmacies and community partners
- Provide sharps lock boxes and containers for encampments in the City of Santa Cruz
- Provide training on syringe litter and safer sharps handling
- Sharps kiosks in public locations

Enhanced Referrals

- Referrals to social, behavioral and medical care
- Educational materials at SSP locations
- Overdose prevention
- Narcan distribution
- Onsite rapid HIV and hepatitis C testing

DRAFT SSP has increased investment in syringe litter control over the years

Recommendations to improve syringe litter reporting & response through a centralized system (from June 8, 2021)

- 1. Relevant County departments, such as HSA and DPW should continue to collaborate on countywide strategies to reduce syringe litter.
- 2. Maintain existing disposal strategies, such as the kiosk program across all jurisdictions.
- 3. Leverage existing litter-cleanup infrastructure for syringe litter response, including expansion of contracts with litter-cleanup organizations to support syringe cleanup efforts.
- 4. Utilize the My Santa Cruz county mobile application (app) for easier reporting and response in the unincorporated county regions.

Roles and Responsibilities of HSA, DPW and ISD

HSA

To improve partnerships and service coordination with our cities, non-profits, and private organizations to have an impact on all litter and to ensure syringe litter is addressed efficiently.

ISD

To build the Syringe
Function in My Santa Cruz
County App, supporting
data collection software,
and providing reporting
suggestions based on needs
expressed by DPW, the SSP
and collaborating agencies.

DPW

To respond and leverage litter and illegal dumping abatement program resources, which includes syringe litter.

Planning and Implementation Process

Assessment

- Define internal partnership and capacity
- Develop Phased implementation



Planning/Design

- Engaged with litter collection agencies and city jurisdictions
- Identified data collection points
- Developed reporting and response process
- Solicited input from SSP **Advisory Commission**



Implementation

- Phase I "soft launch" on January 25, 2022 to ensure functionality
- Phase II to improve functionality and assess

Workflow of Submittal and Phase I Reporting














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Leveraging existing resources to improve litter response

County of Santa Cruz, Department of Public Works (DPW)

Litter Clean-Up Community Partners

- DPW Roads-Special Crews litter clean-up in County Right-of-Way (ROW)
- Save Our Shores (SOS) Community Clean-up Events at County beaches with volunteers
- Downtown Streets Team (DST) Regular litter cleanup along N. Coast, Felton, and Emeline neighborhood
- Watsonville Works Regular litter clean-up in County areas adjacent to downtown Watsonville

Funding and Expansion of Program

- Leveraging DPW funds to match Cal-Fresh
 Employment Training (CFET) money from HSD to expand program
- Expansion into Emeline Campus neighborhood (Santa Cruz Neighborhood Cleanup Project)
- Expansion into Watsonville
- Further expansion into other areas in the County
